# Where's Father Christmas?

## Explanatory Notes:

This composition is fun, simple and light hearted. With some shops stocking their Christmas goodies from September onwards it is hardly surprising that children will frequently ask "How long 'til Christmas?" and "When will Santa be here?" - a bit like having children in the car on a long journey with them repeatedly asking "Are we there yet?". This song has the children repeatedly asking "Where's Father Christmas?" with this part of the chorus based on the notes of a chiming clock. The verses tell the story of how busy Santa is and all he has to do before Christmas. It ends with the arrival of Santa and everyone singing "Shhh, He's here!"

The song is scored for two Junior Choirs/groups and an Adult Choir (SATB). However, it may also be sung in other arrangements including:-

- All children all the children sing the tune (Soprano part) during the verses. From bar 95 onwards
  the children will need to be divided into 3 groups Group 1 and Group 2 sing the parts as written for
  their groups in the score, with Group 3 singing the adult Soprano part.
- All adults divide into two groups to sing the two children's parts during the choruses. From bar 95 some adults will need to sing the children's parts whilst all the other adult parts are covered at the same time.

The Sleigh Bells are an essential part of the song. The Sleigh Bells represent Santa's sleigh and play quietly throughout as Santa is far away, then towards the end they get louder as Santa is getting closer, then just before the very end the Sleigh Bells stop suddenly because the sleigh has stopped outside and Santa is here!

The part for Tubular Bells/Hand Bells/Chime Bars (either may be used) symbolises a chiming clock, which represents the passage of time towards Christmas and the arrival of Santa. The notes used are: Middle C (40), D (42), F (45), G (47), A (49), C (52).

The single note on the Triangle is optional and purely for humour, so if preferred it may be omitted. It is the very last beat of the composition when everyone else is silent. The Triangle player needs to be a bit of an actor too – counting through so many bars rest that they fall asleep and are then nudged awake by a fellow performer during the final bars, thus in a panic the Triangle is played (as if by mistake) after everyone has sung "Shhh, He's here!". Alternatively the sleigh bells and triangle can both be played by a single percussionist.

The tuba part is again used for humour - jovially bumbling along portraying Santa himself.

As the lyrics are extremely 'visual' a children's drama group could perform the story or the children could do some actions whilst singing.
